OPTN Membership and Professional Standards Committee Meeting Summary March 28, 2025 Conference Call

Introduction

Membership and Professional Standards Committee (MPSC) met virtually via Webex in both closed and open session on March 28, 2025, to discuss the following agenda items:

- 1. MPSC AOOS Critical Comment Response
- 2. OPO Performance Monitoring Enhancement Update
- 3. Consent Agenda for Cases
- 4. Membership Issues
- 5. Compliance Issues

The following is a summary of the (Sub)Committee's discussions.

1. MPSC AOOS Critical Comment Response

The Committee received an informational overview of the MPSC related portions of the OPTN plan developed in response to the HRSA Allocation Out of Sequence Directive. The MPSC Allocations Review Subcommittee provided input into the plan that was approved by MPSC leadership.

Summary of discussion:

The Committee made no decisions.

The Committee had no questions or discussion.

Next steps:

Once HRSA approves a work plan, the Committee will begin work on the plan tasks.

2. OPO Performance Monitoring Enhancement Update

Contractor staff provided a summary of the discussion and recommendations of the OPO Performance Monitoring Enhancement Workgroup at its February 6, 2025, meeting. The Workgroup received a presentation from the SRTR on its work on risk-adjusted OPO donation rates, transplant rates and recovery rates. Following questions and discussion, the Workgroup concluded that one or more of these metrics could provide an interim solution for MPSC OPO performance evaluation until additional data is available following implementation of the HRSA Data Directive. The Workgroup recommended that the MPSC request data from the SRTR on potential flagging thresholds for these metrics.

The SRTR presented information to the Committee on the three metrics, OPO donation rate, transplant rate, and recovery rate, including an explanation of the risk-adjustment that is incorporated into these metrics.

Summary of discussion:

Decision: The MPSC approved the Workgroup recommendation to request that the SRTR provide data on potential flagging thresholds for the OPO metrics by a vote of 19 Yes, 0 No, 0 Abstentions.

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The Workgroup Chair asked about SRTR efforts to build predictive models that could help with the two-year lag in the currently available data. SRTR staff responded that there had been some work done on a predictive model that could be useful for OPO's internal performance improvement efforts but that the SRTR would not recommend that such a model be used for performance evaluation at this time.

In response to a question about incorporating geographic differences, SRTR staff responded that the models consider the geographic variability for characteristics that are included in the currently available datasets, such as age, sex, and race. There have been some non-SRTR studies that are exploring census variables that might improve what is currently available and the SRTR can explore that further if the MPSC requests. SRTR staff confirmed that deaths such as homicide, suicide, firearm injuries, drug overdoses, and motor vehicle accidents are included the models through the International Classification of Diseases, Tenth Revision (ICD-10) codes for standard external causes of death. The Committee also discussed whether it was possible to incorporate factors related to transportation logistics to which the SRTR staff responded it was something they could explore.

Next steps:

 OPTN contractor will submit a data request to HRSA and the SRTR for data on potential flagging thresholds.

3. Consent Agenda for Cases

Decision #1: The Committee approved the consent agenda in closed session.
